### KOREAN DREAMS: PAINTINGS & SCREENS FROM THE JOSEON DYNASTY The Lee Ufan Collection in the Musée Guimet, Paris

5 March – 8 June 2009 Asian Galleries, ground level Free admission

This exhibition marks the first showing of traditional Korean painting at the Gallery, and features Korean screens, hanging scrolls and album leaves dating from the 17th to the 19th centuries. It brings together an unfamiliar yet unique tradition that was shaped by a love of landscape, an empathy with shamanist beliefs, lively folk traditions, and a Confucian-inspired love for books, learning and the literature of Korea and China.

Assembled over many years by the leading contemporary artist Lee Ufan, the collection, regarded by specialists as one of the most important ever assembled by a single connoisseur, illustrates the principal themes that concerned Korean painters in the later part of the Joseon period (1392–1910). The exhibition includes themes such as calligraphy, landscape, bird-and-flower, mythical animals, and portraits.
